The Song of the Earth will invigorate institutions and individuals with Mahler's intense awareness of the preciousness of our planet and our humble place in the unfolding of life, urging us all to listen to the Earth's song and stand up for its protection. Inspiring both the mind and the heart through the arts, these projects will celebrate the human condition and underscore our reliance on a thriving environment.

Rather than organize its own events, The Song of the Earth will act as a collecting point of projects that are inspired by Gustav Mahler's masterpiece The Song of the Earth, whether they be concerts, symposia, books, compositions, lectures, recordings, films, theater, educational programs The relationship to the music is defined loosely as a borrowing of texts, a musical quotation, or a reference to the composer's perspective on nature and humanity. Mahler Foundation will assist in developing ideas and enable broader delivery through its imprimatur and global outreach, thus multiplying the impact of these efforts as they conjoin around the world.

Listening to Earth's song can take on a personal dimension, too, and so The Song of the Earth will ask individuals for their reflections on what they hear, whether in the wind or in their hearts, as they contemplate our relationship to this precious place in the cosmos.

Why this project now?

- We have reached a breaking point in the ecological balance of our planet by destroying its habitats, polluting its air and water, and depleting its resources.
- Extreme weather and the spread of new diseases, such as COVID-19, are just two examples of the consequences we are experiencing right now.
- At stake is not just quality of life but the continuation of our species and way of living as we know it.
- The rate of depletion and the worsening of conditions are so dire that only a concerted, worldwide effort can succeed in making the necessary changes.
- Failure to address the situation is not an option, for it would lead to environmental collapse, mass migration, civil unrest, and much more.

In bringing these disparate elements together, in celebrating creativity in the service of our Earth in projects around the world, we will be conjoining Mahler, music, and a vast concern of our time. **We will inspire and connect. We will take Mahler Beyond.**

The Song of the Earth

"Songs of the Earth"

A project stemming from Mahler Foundation's initiative, The Song of the Earth, to inspire the talents of young people to create artworks that celebrate the Earth and raise awareness of our reliance on its precious resources. Designed as a template for implementation in countries around the world.

Key elements

- 1. young people
- 2. new creations
- 3. multiple art forms
- 4. an emphasis on song
- 5. local and regional organizations
- 6. outreach to underserved communities
- 7. topics on protecting our planet
- 8. a connection to Gustav Mahler

Considerations in Implementation

- Working in the first instance with schools and music schools around the country to promote the campaign for young people to write their own "Songs of the Earth" of 2 to 5 minutes each.
- These institutions could also provide composition workshops, mentoring, and performers to develop ideas and give feedback.
- Participants would be invited to submit their compositions to a competition. A number (5-10?) finalists/winners would attend a workshop on orchestrating their songs, and the final versions would be performed at a leading national venue, with each composer introducing their own piece.
- Where possible performers should be drawn from young musicians' ensembles.
- Bringing in other art forms would be desirable and could involve visual art, dance, poetry, etc. everything collectively a "Song to the Earth". We could also tie this to the creation of the texts used in the songs.
- Local communities must be involved, both in giving participants this creative opportunity and in providing a framework for presenting the artworks inspired by the initiative, perhaps a local exhibit combined with a recital.
- Environmental education has to be integral to the presentation and rollout of these projects; a background must also be given in relation to Gustav Mahler and his work *The Song of the Earth.*
- Funding should come from local sources, with pro bono talent stemming from regional musical (and arts) institutions whenever possible.
- A national project manager must be assigned to coordinate activities, ensure fulfillment of the goals of the initiative, and keep Mahler Foundation informed of the state of progress and any matters that need to be addressed.
- Along with this initiative and coinciding with its conclusion could be performances of music presented by internationally recognized artists committed to the ideals of Mahler Foundation's overarching initiative, The Song of the Earth.
